The Honorable Elaine Chao:

On behalf of the Gaston-Cleveland-Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization (GCLMPO), please accept this letter of support for the Gastonia-Lowell Lineberger Connector FY 2017 TIGER grant application.

The **City of Gastonia** in conjunction with the **City of Lowell** are seeking TIGER Discretionary Grant funds to complete the funding package necessary to implement the Lineberger Connector project between the two communities. Protecting the mobility of almost 78,000 people - 74,000 in Gastonia and 4,000 in Lowell - in communities located along the I-85 corridor is difficult. Understanding that these communities are located just west of the largest city in North Carolina and are beginning to feel the pressures of a neighboring community, brings to light a challenge that requires the development of the Lineberger Connector project. The Lineberger Connector project blends the needs of all mode types into a plan for residents and visitors, all while respecting the history and amenities that give these communities their charm and unique personality. A **bridge**. A **bike path**. A **pedestrian link**. A **network connector**. A **gateway**. An **opportunity**. The Lineberger Connector will complete the network, braiding the communities together through this overly congested network.

The Lineberger Connector project includes new location roadway and a new bridge over I-85 connecting both sides of I-85 between Franklin Boulevard and NC 7 to the north. The construction of the Lineberger Connector completes the network between Exit 21 (Cox Road) and Exit 22 (S. Main Street) east and west, and NC 7 and Franklin Boulevard north and south. The project also provides for a second, grade separated crossing between Exits 21 and 22 over I-85.

This project will **improve traffic flow** for residents of both communities as well as regional commuters. The new grade separation will unlock more than 450 acres of property that is ripe for local and regional development. These improvements are providing **greater economic mobility** for a broad range of citizens in both communities as well as leveraging infrastructure improvements to **stimulate economic growth**. The Lineberger Connector project has the potential to be an **economic engine** for the region.




WHEREAS, traffic in the area surrounding the project is experiencing significant congestion and delay, with many intersections performing at a Level of Service F during peak periods and;

WHEREAS, this proposed project presents a unique opportunity to provide accessibility to an area that could produce significant economic development and job creation along Interstate 85;


